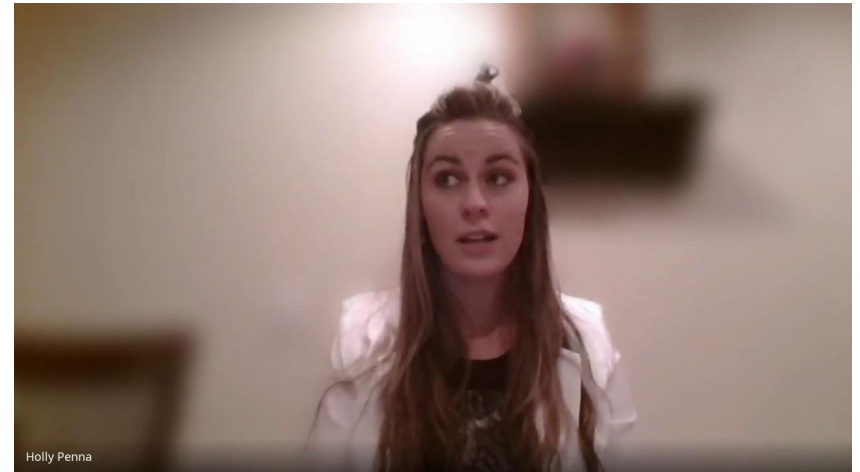

Chapter Accomplishments

For the **2019-2020 school year**, the Haddonfield Chapter of the NHS completed well over 2,400 hours of community service, in spite of Covid limiting school-sponsored service activities for most of the second semester.

Some of the service projects to which the **group being inducted in 2020** has contributed includes making sandwiches at the Cathedral Kitchen, working with Urban Promise to build and plan a garden, building or refurbishing play spaces for younger children, collecting and delivering PPE to schools during the pandemic, coaching or participating in sporting events serving special needs children, and helping to organize clothing drives and helping to deliver clothes to needy families, among many other impressive examples of service.



NHS History

- National Honor Society is a national organization to recognize individual student academic achievement
- The National Chapter was founded in 1921 by Principal Edward S. Rynearson
- It grew into roughly 1,000 chapters by 1930
- Over 1 million students participate in NHS or NJHS from all around the country. NHS chapters can also be found in Puerto Rico, Canada, and Asia



NHS Scholarship Information

- Since 1946, the National Honor Society has given out more than \$17 million in scholarship grants

Award Distribution

- 1 National Winner – \$25,000 scholarship
- 24 national finalists – \$5,625 scholarship
- 575 national semifinalists – \$3,200 scholarship
- Total scholarships awarded: 600
- Total scholarship distribution: \$2 million
