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Letter from the Superintendent

March 31, 2021


Dear Parents, Guardians, Staff and Students,

When our students and staff left school on March 16, 2020, most of us could not imagine they would continue in a virtual learning model through the end of the year and return to school in a hybrid model in September. The abrupt shift required schools to quickly re-imagine how to best deliver virtual instruction and serve our students. And of course the continuation of the pandemic required many additional changes in the areas of PPE, cleaning, ventilation, meal deliveries, athletics, and more.

Today we are approaching the point we have been anticipating for many, many months: initiating Phase III, bringing ALL students to school, all day, five days per week! (Of course, students and families may continue to choose the $100 \%$ virtual model through the end of this school year.)

The Leadership Team of Haddonfield School District has been working on this plan for months, anticipating the time when safety and health conditions would allow us to move forward. The following pages will show the new Phase III schedules, set to begin April 19th (grades 1-12) if major indicators continue to improve. (Preschool and kindergarten will continue in their current schedules.)

It is important to note, however, that the schedules for the original hybrid model (cohort A attending Monday and Tuesday, cohort B attending Thursday and Friday), the Phase II combined-cohort model, and the contingency model (if schools are forced to close by state or county mandates) are still contained in these pages. If health conditions worsen, we might have to return to one of these more restrictive schedules.

We appreciate the difficulties and the stresses placed on students, staff and families over the last year. We also realize that each of us has unique circumstances, perspectives, and feelings about how best to return to school. During this process, the Phase III model was explored and reviewed with feedback from families, students, staff, community members and frequent consultation with our district physician and nursing staff. As always, our planning must balance safety, instruction, and operations in a way to provide the best solution for all 1,500 families and 350 staff members in our district.

Letter from the Superintendent contid ...


We continue to follow guidelines and absorb information from Camden County, the New Jersey Department of Education and other health and safety organizations as we plan to bring students into our buildings for more in-person instruction. Regular updates and changes have the potential to require us to rethink and rework our plans.

The result of this work is spelled out in this REVISED (March 31, 2021) document, "Haddonfield School District: On the Road Back." Within this document, families and staff will find information about our guiding principles, the process followed, instructional models, FAQs, and more. Phase III schedules begin on page 20.

Haddonfield School District takes our responsibilities to our families, staff, and community seriously. We understand our obligation to meet the safety and educational needs of our students and staff. We have a proud history of providing our students with a high quality education, and we are committed to maintaining those standards. As a result, the Phase III plan outlined in this document provides a balance of ensuring a safe and healthy environment while also providing access to a quality education.

## How to Use this Document

This document provides information about contributors, the decision-making process, sample class schedules, state requirements, health procedures and more. We ask you to familiarize yourself with our plans so you can make an informed decision about your student's(s') attendance in school this year.


## PHASE III

Phase III learning plan is set to begin April 19 (grades 1-12). Phase III model brings all students to school, all day, five days per week. Lunches are managed with some distancing. Kindergarten (all mornings) and preschool (AM/PM sessions) continue in their current models.
Successful entry into Phase III is dependent on major indicators remaining stable or improving. Schedules for all grade levels follow on pages 20-23.

## HYBRID MODELS

Haddonfield School District opened on September 8th with a hybrid learning plan that includes some in-person learning and some virtual learning.

Phase II combined cohort/hybrid learning plan began March 1st (K-2) and March 15th (grades 3-12).


## VIRTUAL MODEL

If you choose not to send your student(s) to school for the hybrid model, your student(s) may stay home and the district will provide virtual instruction. See page 24 for a sample schedule.


## CONTINGENCY MODEL if schools are required to close

If the state or county agencies dictate school closures, we will proceed with our contingency plans for $100 \%$ virtual learning.

## Return Phases

Phase I: School began September 8th with a hybrid model.
Phase II: We implemented Phase II Combined Cohort model in March.
Phase III: We plan to move into Phase III April I9 (grades I-I2)


Phase I:
Students return on an A/B cohort hybrid model with both in-person and virtual learning, 2-days in school with a reduced day (approximately 4 hours per day) and 3 days at home per week. There is an online-only option.

Phase IA: (February 17) Elementary students with IEPs began attending in school four half-days per week.

Phase II:
Hybrid combined cohort model: students attend four mornings a week, maintaining Virtual Wednesdays and lunch at home.

Kindergarten will attend five half days. Preschool attendance remains unchanged: five half days (a.m. or p.m.).

There is an online-only option for all students.

## Phase III:

Full return to a normal school day. Adjustments made to lunch schedules and spacing.

Kindergarten (five mornings) and preschool (AM/PM sessions) continue in their current models.

In an effort to provide an enhanced online learning experience, there will be a greater emphasis on synchronous learning. The expectation is that all teachers meet with their students for live instruction for a minimum of 30-minutes per period. Teachers will be available to students for the entirety of the class period.

State Requirements and Resources


## School districts must:

- Create a Pandemic Response Team with diverse representation from the school community to centralize, expedite, and implement COVID-19 related decisionmaking.
- Follow NJDOE standards and provide instruction across all key content areas.
- Follow IDEA, 504 and ADA, plus all other special education laws and protocols.

- Adopt contingency plans for emergency operations in the event facility closure becomes necessary

All (PK-12) students are required to wear face coverings unless exempted due to health conditions. Disposable masks, provided by the district, will also be available.
Students who cannot wear a face covering for medical reasons will be provided a desk shield and/or face shield.

Temperature checks occur daily for all students.
Students will wash hands for at least 20 seconds at regular intervals, including before eating, after using the bathroom, and after blowing their noses/coughing/sneezing. When hand washing is not available, hand sanitizer should be used.
Number of students in bathrooms will be limited and every other stall will be in use.
Students will remain in classrooms when possible; teachers will travel.
Portable desk shields will be available for small group instruction.

STAFF Face coverings are mandatory. Staff will have the option to wear a face shield (provided by the district) as an additional precaution. All staff received N95 masks.
Temperature checks occur daily.
N95 masks and gowns are available in nurse's office.
COVID-19 screening conducted daily.
Staff will wash hands for at least 20 seconds at regular intervals, including before eating, after using the bathroom, and after blowing their noses/coughing/sneezing. When hand washing is not available, hand sanitizer should be used.

Visitors will not be allowed during the school day.
Masks are required for emergency school visits.

## Enhanced cleaning protocols

Water fountains will not be in use. Bottle filling stations will be available.
Isolation rooms will be set up in every building.
Hand sanitizing stations will be in each classroom and throughout buildings.
Physical guides will be installed to help ensure that staff and students remain at least six feet apart.
Increased frequency for disinfecting bathrooms and high-touch points, including rest room and common areas disinfected 3 times while students are in buildings. All classrooms and office areas disinfected once nightly, and buses disinfected at the conclusion of each transportation run.
We have increased the state minimum of $10 \%$ fresh air circulation to a $20 \%$ minimum of fresh air at all times. While the minimum will be $20 \%$, based on the weather, this can reach as high as $100 \%$. We will also be running our HVAC systems in the evenings and on weekends to increase the fresh air circulation. We installed MERV-13 filters in all HVAC units, HEPA air purifiersers were installed in all workspaces that do not have direct access to windows. Odorox hydroxyl generators have been purchased for all district nurse offices. These devices generate hydroxyls and other molecules that naturally kill bacteria, viruses, and mold.

## General Safety Procedures

GENERAL
During the pandemic, Haddonfield School District has taken every precaution to protect the health and safety of our students and staff. Using guidelines from organizations such as NJDOH, NJSIAA, NJEA and the CDC, we created the helpful "Decision Tree" document, shown below. The Decision Tree document includes the current protocols for isolation, quarantine and travel.

Please note: Because these guidelines change periodically, we suggest that families check the online version of the Decision Tree document which we update regularly.

## Quarantine Protocol

## - 14 Days--

- CDC, NJDOH, and HSD continue to endorse quarantine for 14 days.
- Who needs to quarantine? People who have been in close contact with someone who has COVID-19.
- Stay home and watch for symptoms until 14 days after the last day of exposure.
- People who develop symptoms again within 3 months of their first bout of COVID-19 may need to be tested again if there is no other cause identified for their symptoms.
- " Household members may be required to stay home for a minimum of 24 days.

Exemption from Close Contact Quarantine
- People who were positive for COVID-19 within the past 3 months (from date of positive molecular test) and remain symptom free.
- Individuals who have been fully vaccinated are excluded from quarantine due to exposure for 90 days beginning two weeks after full vaccination.



## Travel Protocol

New Jersey strongly discourages all non-essential interstate travel at this time. Individuals who have been vaccinated against COVID-19 should continue to follow the State's travel advisory. Travelers and NJ residents returning from any U.S. state or territory beyond the immediate region (New York, Connecticut, Pennsylvania, and Delaware) should self-quarantine following the Travel Restrictions To or From New Jersey. Compliance is expected.

## $+$

- If travel is unavoidable, travelers should consider getting tested with a molecular test (not an antibody test) $1-3$ days before the trip and again 3-5 days after the trip.
- If travelers test positive, they should self-isolate for at least 10 days and should postpone travel during that time.
- If travelers test negative, they should quarantine for a full 7 days after travel and proof of a negative molecular test should be provided to the school nurse.
- If testing is not available (or if the results are delayed), travelers should quarantine for 10 days after travel.

## Increased Risks of the (1.) Model

## What are some of the increased risks associated with the Phase III model?

Your child will be at greater risk for being exposed to and contracting COVID-I9 returning in Phase III. This is due to a greater number of students in the classrooms for longer durations, along with the risk associated with unmasking while eating lunch.

NJDOH and CDC revised physical distancing recommendations to reflect at least three feet between students in classrooms. The CDC continues to recommend six feet of physical distancing when masks cannot be worn, such as while eating and drinking. Additionally, NJDOH continues to use the proximity of six feet or less for more than 15 minutes to determine the need for quarantining persons in contact with a COVID-19 case.

While students will be at least six feet apart during lunch, the risk does increase when eating lunch indoors, which will be the case when weather conditions do not allow outside eating.

Based on available data, in-person learning in schools has not been associated with substantial community transmission. Though outbreaks do occur in school settings, multiple studies have shown that transmission within school settings when mitigation strategies are in place is typically lower than or at least similar to levels of community transmission. While we do monitor student, class, grade-level, and school trends of student symptoms reported, contact tracing only occurs for confirmed cases of COVID.

If a symptomatic student does not get tested for COVID and is only excluded due to symptoms, contact tracing will not occur, and you will not be notified. You will only be notified if a close contact of your child tests positive for COVID. This is in accordance with NJDOH guidelines. Also, your child may be at risk based on not being told of possible exposure to a close contact who has symptoms but has not been tested. This in turn leads to the possibility of unknowingly exposing others in your household and (y)our community.

When we are made aware of a COVID+ individual in our schools, our contact tracing includes an analysis of the class seating charts, as well as interviews with teachers. The students sitting adjacent to an infected individual, even if at six feet, are provided notices and required to be excluded from school. Factors that weigh into this include the degree of fresh air circulation in the classroom, indoor vs. outdoor, the potential that students moved their chairs/desks during the infectious period, the type of mask worn (and we can't guarantee that a student didn't have his/her mask down/below nose for a period of time), and that most class periods are well above 10-15 minutes.

In most instances during our current hybrid/cohort model, there are typically two to three students seated either at or slightly within six feet who are deemed close contacts and are required to be excluded from school for 14 days. With the Phase II/III combined-cohort models, instead of two to three students deemed close contacts, that number will likely increase to four to six students at the elementary level and seven to 24 students at the middle and high school levels.

Using head-to-head measurements, we were on average, able to achieve between three and five feet of physical distancing. In some K-2 classrooms, tables will be employed with students seated facing each other with three to five feet of physical distance, using head-to-head measurements, and with the use of a desk shield.

We also continue to urge our school community to get COVID testing when symptoms are present and/or if you or your child has a known exposure to a COVID+ individual and/or an individual displaying COVID-like symptoms. We cannot require COVID testing.

The District will not be using a learning choice selection for Phase III; however, accommodations will be made for families who choose to change from in-person to virtual, or vice versa. Please notify your school's principal to inquire about a potential change.

Please note, according to Governor Murphy, as of now, there will not be a remote option for families during the 2021-22 school year. As reported
by NJ.com on March 25, 2021:
Gov. Phil Murphy said all school districts in the state should prepare to be open for five full days of in-person instruction with no option for parents to choose to keep students remote when the 202I-22 academic year starts in September.
"I want to be unequivocal about this. We are expecting Monday through Friday, in-person, every school, every district," the Governor said at his Coronavirus press briefing. "Obviously, if the world goes sideways, we have to revisit that. But as of this sitting, the answer is no (remote option)."
